






































Although all synagogues may look different, they all contain a number of things which they have in common.

The Holy Ark

All synagogues have a special cupboard with a curtain over it. This is where the Torah scrolls are kept.








There are usually words above the ark which say either 'Know before whom you stand' or 'I have set the Lord always before me'.



The first letters or numbers on the Ten Commandments are usually found on the doors or curtain of the Ark.








This is the stand where the Torah scrolls are read from.

The Menorah


A seven-branched candlestick.
