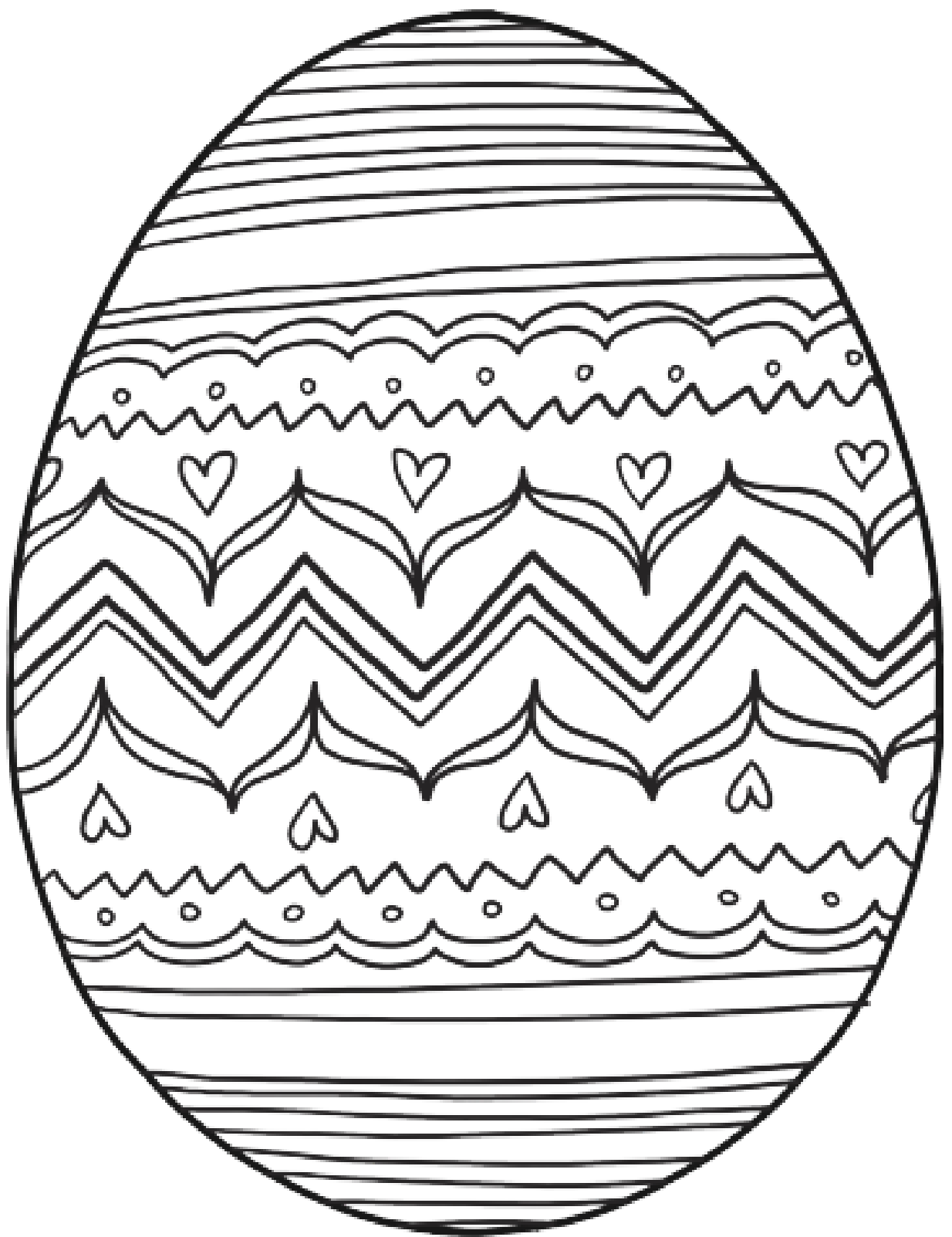

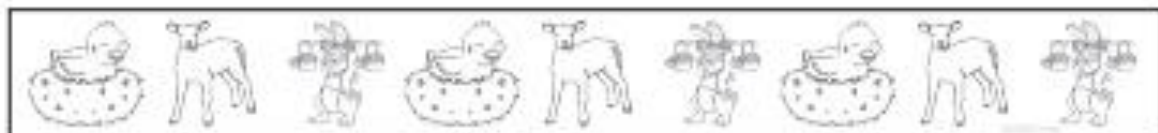
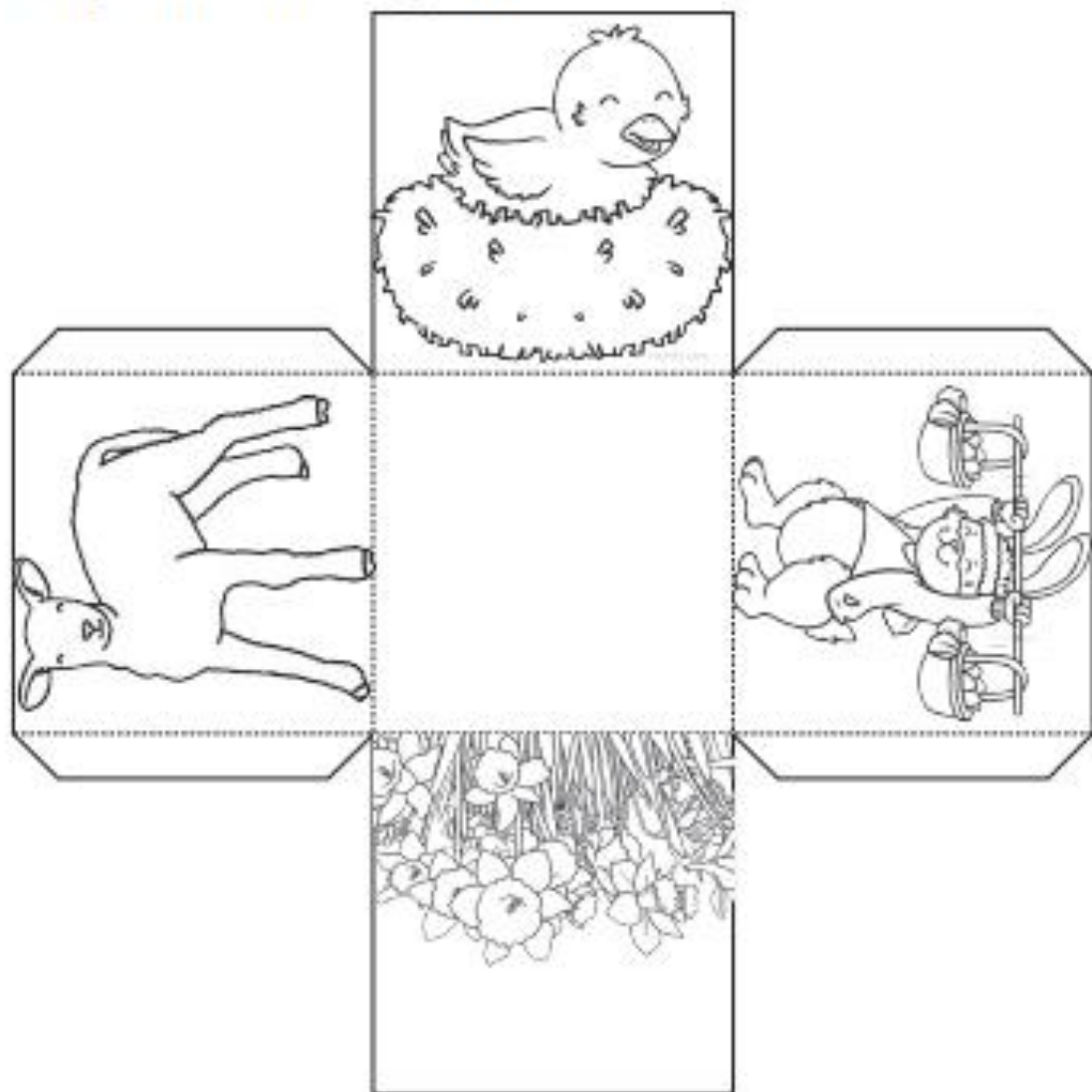




## Easter Themed Basket Craft

# Chocolate nests

You will need (for 8 nests)

Equipment A large plastic bowl  
A large heat-proof bowl  
A saucepan of hot water  
A tablespoon  
Small paper cake cases.

## Ingredients

200g chocolate  
3 Shredded Wheat  
Sugar Coated mini eggs

## method

1. Crumble the Shredded Wheat in a big bowl

2. Break the chocolate into small pieces and place in a heat-proof bowl.
