

## Lesson 1

Prepositional phrases (slide 14 of PowerPoint)

Prepositional phrases are used to tell the reader where the noun is located. It is another way of adding more information to the sentences. Complete the prepositional phrase worksheet Lesson 1. Then create your own prepositional phrases.

## Lesson 2

Clauses (slide 18 of PowerPoint)

Clauses are a group of words that contain the subject and a verb. The subject of the clause is the noun that is doing the action, whereas a phrase does not contain a verb.

Have a look at the slide 19 and decide which of those are a clause and contain a verb or a phrase that does not have a verb. Main clauses are clauses that make sense on their own. On the worksheet identify main clauses and then write your own.

## Lesson 3

Subordinate clauses (Slide 22 of PowerPoint)

Often in complex sentences, we extend the sentence with the use of a subordinating clause. This is done with the use of a subordinating conjunction and then the clause. The clause however, does not make sense if it was to be written on its own. Please complete English lesson 3 worksheet.
