

### Lesson 1

Read chapter 1 of the Anglo-Saxon Boy. On page 25 is a description of Earl Harold. Draw a picture to show what you think Earl Harold would look like based on the descriptions on this page and in the chapter.

### Lesson 2

The Prologue and Chapter 1 have lots of information in to start the book. Now you have read both, choose the 10 parts that you think are most important. Once you have decided on those 10, organise them into a pyramid shape with the most important part at the top on its own and the least important four along the bottom of the pyramid.

### Lesson 3

Using what you have read so far, create a storyboard covering all the key points of the story, this is to help you remember the order of the story so far.

### Lesson 4

Complete the role on the wall (gingerbread man) for a character of your choice we have met in the story so far. Remember that the actions go around the outside and the feelings go in the gingerbread man.

### Lesson 5

Time for another speed write. You have a 5-minute planning period and 20 minutes of writing and in this time they write as much as they can. Their writing can take any form and be written for anybody to read, but has to be related to the following picture:
