
WHAT IS SHADING?


This week I want you to practice your shading. Spend a lesson practicing different types of shading.

After you have practiced, pick something in your house that you want to practice shading and draw a best copy.




What it is and How YOU can do it.





- 1. Draw and shade exactly what you SEE, nothing more, nothing less.
- 2. Use directional shading. Follow the form of the object you are shading. Curved lines for rounded objects and straight lines for flat objects.
 - 3. NO OUTLINES!! Edges should be created where two values meet.






Use an HB, 6B and 2B pencil and a blending stomp to make the forms on the left look like the forms on the right. Color carefully.
