1	<b><u>Spellings</u></b> - Practise writing this week's spellings and using them in a sentence (as our homework each week). Also check Spelling Frame for some new spellings to practise online linked to our spelling rules.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Spelling grid on PPT.</li> <li>Spelling Frame</li> </ul>
2	<b><u>'Small Town Superheroes'</u></b> – play this game online – it's a fun way to learn and practise different spelling, grammar and punctuation rules.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Link on PPT</li> </ul>
3	<b><u>'Tuesday'</u></b> – This is one of my favourite books that I have used with Year 2 so I thought I would share it here with you all. Have a look at the front cover and predict what you think it might be about.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Front cover of text</li> </ul>
4	<b><u>'Tuesday'</u></b> – Have a look through the PPT of the story – it's a special story because it has hardly any words! Using what you can see from the pictures, create a role on the wall about the characters of the frogs. 5	<b><u>Common exception words</u></b> – read the short text and see if you can spot the mistakes that Mr Whoops has made. He has spelt some of the common exception words wrong. ### Maths

Task	Activity	Resources in pack
1	<b><u>Times tables practise:</u></b> Practise your times tables on 'Hit the Button', Times Tables Rockstars or using any of the other resources from the previous weeks. <b>OR</b> <b><u>Number bonds practise to 10 and 20:</u></b> Carrying on practising using 'Hit the Button' or playing the game 'Ping-Pong' that was on a learning pack a few weeks ago.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</a></li> </ul>
2	<b><u>Money</u></b> – order the 8 coins in our currency in order from smallest to largest. You can either use the sheet provided on the PPT or see if your family have the coins for you to do this for real!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coin ordering on PPT.</li> </ul>
3	<b><u>Money</u></b> – There are different questions included on the PPT for you to solve. Some involve you adding together different coins and writing the total and some involve you solving word problems.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Range of worksheets on PPT.</li> </ul>

4	<b><u>Monster money</u></b> – find all the different ways you can pay for the monster using only silver coins. The monster costs 45p. Then try the rest of the challenge.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Monster challenge task on PPT.</li> </ul>

1	<b><u>Human stages of growth</u></b> – Look at the pictures of the different stages of human life and put them in order. When you have ordered them, write some of the different things that we can do at each stage. E.g. baby – cry, eat, sleep, adult – drive, work, get married etc.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stages of growth sheet on PPT.</li> </ul>
2	<b><u>Eat well food plate</u></b> - study the ‘Eat well food plate’ and learn the different food groups and what types of food are in each. Have a look in your kitchen cupboards at home and see if you can identify what food groups they belong to.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eat well plate on PPT.</li> </ul>
3	<b><u>Food groups</u></b> – Use the food pyramid to sort the different foods into their correct food groups.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Food pyramid on PPT.</li> </ul>
