1	<u>Spellings</u> - Practise writing this week's spellings and using them in a sentence (as our homework each week). Also check Spelling Frame for some new spellings to practise online linked to our spelling rules.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spelling grid on PPT. • Spelling Frame
2	<u>The Jabberwocky by Lewis Carroll</u> – Read this poem or ask an adult to read it with you as it is a little bit tricky and draw what you think the Jabberwocky looks like using the descriptions and clues that Lewis Carroll has given us.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jabberwocky poem on PPT.
3	<u>Story task – 'The Stadium'</u> – Look at the picture of 'The Stadium' and read the start of the story. See if you can continue the story with what you think will happen next.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Story starter page on PPT.
4	<u>Comprehension questions – 'The Stadium'</u> – Using the picture of 'The Stadium', answer the questions from the PPT.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Questions on PPT.
5	<u>Common exception words</u> – read the short text and see if you can spot the mistakes that Mr Whoops has made. He has spelt some of the common exception words wrong. 1	<u>Times tables practise:</u> Use the games on 'Hit the Button' to practise answering quick-fire questions about your times tables or use TT Rockstars if you prefer. 2	<u>Dart board addition</u> – The dart board has 4 numbers. Imagine you have 3 darts each time. What number sentences could you create? <u>Challenge:</u> use the challenge dartboard and try the same thing again.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dart board on PPT.
