- Class teachers will continue to follow the behaviour policy and only make contact if 'Parent Contact' is reached, anything before parent contact on the behaviour board will be dealt with in school as per policy.
- Teachers will not respond to any email that is sent to them directly.
- Our SENCo, Mrs Pearce, can offer appointments for the days she is in school. This is usually
 Wednesday and Thursday but is subject to change. Appointments must be made via the school
 office.
- Appointments to see members of the Senior Leadership Team must also be made via the school office. Your request will be dealt with by Mrs Jearrad, Mr Booth and Mrs Skeels as appropriate.
- Home-School Communication books have changed this year. Each child will have a reading
 record book for you to record that you are hearing your child read at home, this can also be used
 for non- urgent communication with the class teacher as necessary.

PE Kits

A change for this year is for all children in Years 1 to Year 6 can come to school in their PE kit on PE days. This means the children will get more time to engage in sport during their lesson. Reading with your child

Reading is absolutely fundamental in every child's development. A child's ability to read impacts on every lesson and their life journey. Please listen to your child read at home for at least 10 minutes every day. A good way to check on their understanding is ask them questions about what they have just read. We ask that you sign your child's reading record to show you have listened to the read as we track this in school and discuss progress with you at parents meetings.

Values

Our Cyril Squirrel 5 R's continue to be our main focus in celebration and expectation over the coming year. We will be supporting the children in becoming independent in recognising that they are Ready, Responsible, Resourceful, Resilient and Reflective when returning to school.

Our Christian Values of Love, Hope and Courage will feature strongly throughout with one as a feature each term. We will be looking to present 7 more children with the NAVE (Nursling Award for Values and Etiquette) award at the end of the year!

House points

Children will be earning house points again this year for individual achievement and for their house. Each class has a house point chart in their room. As house points are gathered, the children will get awarded at various milestones.

25 points = badge

50 points = band

75 points = lucky dip

100 points = token for their house team and certificate in assembly.

Break time, Lunch time and Castle

We have all really enjoyed the introduction of the castle to our play times and lunch times. To enable every class to have a day when they are able to use the castle, EYFS/Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 will have separate break times and lunch play times. On Friday's the children who have been identified in Celebration assembly, will be supervised to use the castle altogether.

As a polite reminder, the castle is only to be used during the school day by children who attend the school whilst supervised by school staff. We thank you for your cooperation.

School meals

The children eat in the hall, sat on tables with their class.

Fresh hot meals are prepared on site and can be ordered at morning registration. Free School Meals are available to all those who are entitled to have one.
