

The children were able to see their names, rank, date and age that they died. When inside the church, they were fascinated to hear the story about the bombs that destroyed the glass in the church windows during World War II.

We visit St Johns Church regularly for various church services but often oblivious to the history that the church has. Enthusing the children by learning outside of the classroom and within our local community has so much impact. 

In our experience, many of these concerns can often be most quickly resolved by talking to the class teacher as they know your children best. Please be aware that the Chair of Governors does not become involved unless a formal complaint is logged having completed all previous steps. The Complaints Policy is on the website.

Please use the chart below to know who you need to speak to.

Steps 1	Learning / Classroom issues In the first instance, please arrange to speak to your child's class teacher after school by appointment. Appointments can be made via the school office.	Pastoral / Additional Needs If you're struggling with pastoral issues such as routines, attendance or you just need to reach out, ask the office to book you an appointment to speak to Mrs Mellor (Parent Liaison).	School Administration Please speak to Mrs Manning, Mrs H-C or Mrs Petley in the school office.			
2	If you feel your query has not been resolved, please arrange to speak to Mr Booth or Mrs Skeels (Assistant Headteachers)	Concerns or actions related to Special Educational Needs or pastoral issues still not sorted, ask the office to book you an appointment to speak to Mrs Mellor (SENCO).	If you have a complaint with regards to a member of the office team, go to Step 3.
