

Head Teacher's Message

Over the last few weeks, we have had our annual visit from the local authority to see how well the school is performing. I am delighted to say that the visit was extremely positive. Some of the things noted were how strong relationships are across the school and how adjustment for SEND pupils in the classroom is clear and noticeable.

Also stated in the report

- ★ Staff stability has enabled consistent implementation of development priorities.
- ★ Precision teaching has been reintroduced to address gaps swiftly, supported by the school's nurture/ structure highway model for pupils with additional needs.
- ★ Pupils are engaged with no low level disruption.
- ★ Year 1 provision has been adapted to support transition from Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), with continuous provision in place.
- ★ Learning walks show purposeful learning with positive relationships and effective adult interactions.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our PTA Chair, Gemma Parker and everyone who helped or came along to our PTA Christmas Fayre today. A lot of work goes on behind the scenes to ensure everything runs smoothly. All monies raised will be going directly back to making Nursling a great place for your children to attend.

Governor Pupil Voice Monitoring Visit

Governor Monitoring – November 2025

Pupil Voice

Governors met with a number of pupils from years 3, 4, 5 and 6 as one of their responsibilities to independently establish what pupils feel about their school.



Our recent visit focused upon if pupils are enjoying school in this new academic year and what has been their highlight so far. Governors were interested in how pupils produce a good piece of writing, listened to pupils describe their experiences how teaching methods are implemented in their classroom and their own individual progress.

In addition, pupils were asked whether they feel safe in school and did they know if they had any worries or if upset, what could they do.

We were interested to hear what they had to say regarding behaviour in school, particularly what happens should someone in their class isn't doing the right thing or disrupting their learning. We were keen to know how pupils felt about the new reward system introduced in September.

Finely, we wanted to know what pupils thought about the food being produced in school since the change to the catering provision company at the beginning of November.

The young people we met were candid, governors were fully assured by the end of the visit, that all pupils met, reported they felt safe in school, behaviour is good and teachers rewarded their efforts. Pupils really like and appreciate the new reward system. They spoke of their personal learning experiences and shared which subject they really enjoyed and why. There were many comments how kind the staff are and lessons were fun. We were also told that expectations are high, challenging but fair with lots of help from their teacher and classroom assistant.

Overall, pupils reported the food served at lunch is better than before the change at the beginning of November, liked the options available, really liked the puddings but were disappointed if options ran out. They reported there were some initial setbacks during the first week and as far as they were concerned are no longer a problem. Governors have passed on pupil concerns of favourite choices running out to the school.
