Resilient—I do not give up especially when I am finding things hard.

Resourceful—I can source what I need independently and use what is appropriate.

Reflective—I can think about and action what I would do differently next time.

The children know these well and understand the language we use. Please do use at home to reinforce with your child. At Primary school age, it is less confusing with children if the same terminologies are used by all their known adults.

Miss Holloway, Mrs Marsh and Terri are very proud of you both.


Business and Enterprise Day!

Parent Governor Vacancy

A day in the life of a Parent Governor - by Vicky Dixon

As my eldest child prepares to leave Nursling, and I come to the end of my time as a parent governor, I've been reflecting on the journey. I stepped into the role eight years ago, while working as a nurse and unsure whether I could really contribute. I'm so pleased I applied —it's been both a rewarding and enriching experience.

At first, I assumed a governing board might be full of corporate types in suits. Instead I found a diverse group of motivated, warm-hearted people bringing a rich range of experiences and perspectives—lots of good people to learn from. Everyone gives their time generously, united by a shared goal: to support and improve the opportunities our children receive. That creates a lovely, energising atmosphere in our meetings.

Being a governor is a great opportunity to learn new skills. Skills that I have also been able to bring into my working life. There are many high-quality, free training courses available, which will give you the confidence to fulfill the role.

As parents, we rarely get to see just how much energy, time, care, and dedication our headteacher and staff pour into the school. I've gained such deep appreciation for the commitment they show every single day to our children's learning and wellbeing, and at times in challenging circumstances. There have been many moments when I've wished I could share meeting insights with other parents—to show just how much love and hard work goes on behind the scenes.

A big part of the governor's role is to be a 'critical friend'—to ask questions and offer constructive challenge. Sometimes this can feel at odds with my instinct to celebrate the positives, but I've come to understand that challenge is embraced as part of the school's ongoing commitment to growth and improvement.

One of my favourite parts of the role has been school visits. I remember feeling nervous before my first one—but I loved the school environment so much that I left nursing and moved into education! I particularly enjoy the Year 6 exit interviews—hearing their voices and bringing their opinions back to our meetings has been a real highlight.

If you're a motivated and compassionate person who wants the best for all the children at Nursling—and you're able to maintain confidentiality—I truly recommend considering the role of parent governor. 


