Head Teacher's Message

What a great turnout on Tuesday night from parents across all Romsey Primary and Secondary schools!


The much publicised talk about children and their technology was really insightful. Dr Helen Thomas and Hannah Verney Lloyd, representing 'Parents Against Phone Addiction In Young Adolescents', (PAPAYA), delivered a lot of information about online game content that is harmful to children and included many eye-opening facts.

Did you know that an average 12 year old spends 3 hours 48 minutes a day on screens? This equates to 26.6 hours a week. Children with Problematic Smartphone Usage (PSU) are twice as likely to experience anxiety and three times more likely to have symptoms of depression.

Our children are suffering from low self-esteem and social isolation because they don't have the skills and find it so much harder to socialise face-to-face.

With 25% of 5-7 year olds having access to their own device and 75% of 5-15 year olds gaming online, this is such a poignant topic of discussion.

I have referred to this book before as I have read it myself, and a quote from this was included in this meeting 'We have overprotected our children in the real world while under protecting them online.' If you haven't read The Anxious Generation by Jonathan Haidt, it is well worth a read.

<u>Year 5</u>






