I think we are all really looking forward to being able to recharge our batteries over half term!



Attendance this week

SAFEGUARDING

As a school, we take **safeguarding** children very seriously. As a community, we are all responsible in helping to keep our children safe at home, on the streets and in school.

This week, we have had the Local Authority come into school to do a Safeguarding Review, We wanted them to see what we do and how we can improve things. They observed all our routines and procedures including before school, break time, lunchtime and after school. They read through policies, risk assessments and spoke to staff and children.

Many strengths were identified throughout the course of the review.

As in any workplace, a review is most beneficial when you can take something from it to im-

prove on. Working together, we have identified where tweaks can be made to improve our practice and make safeguarding even stronger.

A reminder to all parents and Carers that children are not supervised on site by the staff team until 8:40am when the classroom doors open, unless they are signed into Breakfast Club.



Pupil Voice

Social, Emotional, Mental Health

Every few weeks, we talk to the children about life in school. We call this 'Pupil Voice'.

The focus for this week was to fit with our safeguarding review to find out how safe the children feel in school. Some of our children even had a chance to talk to the Local Authority when they were in school.

100% of our children have a good friend in school.

96% of our children say that the adults help and care for them in school.

95% of our children know an adult they can talk to in school if there is something worrying them.

Interestingly, the lowest whole school percentage was in response to this...

'I sleep well and come to school feeling refreshed in the morning.'

Only 59% of our children agreed to this. state-

A big well done to this term's Proud Cloud raffle winners at After School Club. The winners are Ellie and Henry in Year 5, they both won some exciting prizes.



On the Gate Board Update







Put your hands together to make a sphere over your head - this is your mood, in the sky.

Lateness and Requests for Authorised Absence

Children should be in school by **8.50am** each day, when registration begins.

It is important that all children make a good start to the day and are ready to learn.


If a child arrives after 8.50am, they will be given a 'late' mark.

Late arrivals disrupt the whole class and children who arrive late are often embarrassed and unsettled because they have missed important instructions.

If children arrive in school after 9.20am they will be marked as an unauthorised absence

Requests for Authorised Absence

Schools are only allowed to authorise absence from school in exceptional circumstances. In making a request for an authorised absence from school you will need to explain why the circumstances are exceptional. There is no general right to authorise absence



for a family holiday. If you take your child out of school without permission the schsence will be unauthorised and we will consider legal action.

School Dinners

Fed up with making packed lunches? Why not order a school dinner?

Children choose from a vegetarian or meat option, and cost £3 for a freshly cooked main meal and pudding, payable via Scopay. Special diets can be catered for by prior arrangement.

In our experience, many of these concerns can often be most quickly resolved by talking to the class teacher as they know your children best. Please be aware that the Chair of Governors does not become involved unless a formal complaint is logged having completed all previous steps. The Complaints Policy is on the website.














Year 6 - Secondary School Applications
