Bringing Scooters to School Policy

Nursling C.E. Primary School recognises the many positive benefits of pupils riding their scooters to and from school and actively encourage this form of travel.

Benefits of riding a scooter to school include:

- Improving health through physical activity.
- Establishing positive active travel behaviour.
- Promoting independence and improving safety awareness.
- Reducing congestion, noise and pollution in the community.
- Reducing environmental impact of the journey to school.

Role of the pupil:

- 1. To ride to school sensibly
- 2. To push their scooter on the school site and to the cycle & scooter pods
- 3. To lock the scooter securely to the cycle/scooter pod, with a lock provided by their parents

Role of the school:

- 1. To provide and maintain cycle & scooter pod storage
- 2. Nursling C.E. Primary School is not responsible for scooters brought on to or left on school premises and is therefore not liable for pupils' bicycles being stolen or damaged by a third party.
- 3. The Headteacher will notify parents if children do not adhere to the School Scooter Policy and permission leave their scooter at school will be withdrawn until the issues identified have been satisfactorily addressed.

Role of the parent:

- 1. To ensure the scooter is in good working order and well maintained.
- 2. To provide a sturdy lock to secure the scooter to the cycle/scooter pod at school Understand that all property left at the school is at the owner's risk
- 3. Ascertain whether their household insurance covers the loss/damage/personal liability of their child's use of the scooter when it is away from the home address
