

#### We've already looked at this rule...

To add '-ing', '-ed', '-er', '-est' or '-y' to words ending in '-e' with a consonant before it, remove the '-e' before adding the suffix (ending).

If a word has only one syllable, ends with a consonant and has a single vowel before the consonant...

...then the consonant is **doubled** before the suffix (ending) is added.

...double the consonant before '-ing' is added.

To add '-ed' to a word of one syllable, ending with a consonant that has a single vowel before the consonant...

...double the consonant before '-ed' is added.

pat  $\rightarrow$  patted | hum  $\rightarrow$  hummed

# Adding '-er'

To add '-er' to a word of one syllable, ending with a consonant that has a single vowel before the consonant...

...double the consonant before '-er' is added.



# Adding '-est'

To add '-est' to a word of one syllable, ending with a consonant that has a single vowel before the consonant...

...double the consonant before '-est' is added.



### Adding '-y'

To add '-y' to a word of one syllable, ending with a consonant that has a single vowel before the consonant...

...double the consonant before '-y' is added.
