### Author Intent

How does Katherine Rundell use emotive language and description to help the readers infer what is going on? What does she mean by Feo was a stormy girl?

### Create character profiles of main characters in The Wolf Wilder.

Can you draw each character and create character profiles of Marina and Rakov.? Here are some of my ideas-

Marina: caring, isolated, 33, scarred, resourceful, brave, mother, caring, supportive,

Rakov: evil, old, brutal, mad, vicious, rude, unkind, powerful, mean, contemptuous, overpowering, controlling, nasty,

Try Feo and Ilya:

Feo: young, scarred, feral- meets the wolves half way, prefers company of wolves than men, loved, secure, happy, content, brave, knowledgeable, cares for animals

Ilyas: young, kind, caring, curious, loving, hungry, thin, malnourished, troubled, haunted, soldier, abused, treated badly.

Can you add any more? Can you beat my vocabulary?

### The Wolves

Listen to Chapter 3: listen to the descriptions of the wolves- what are their distinguishing features? Can you draw White, Grey and Black? Can you add description and write a paragraph about each wolf?

### Diary Entries

I want you to think about Feo in different parts of the book and a diary from her point of view. Chapter 1, Chapter 5, Chapter 7, Chapter 10, Chapter 13 and Chapter 15. How is she feeling, what does she see? What is point of view? What are her thoughts and feelings?

Once you have done that I want you to write another diary entry from the point of view of the wolves. How are they feeling? What do they see? How do they react to certain events?

I am really looking forward to what you come up with here, looking at things from the wolves point of view makes you really think about the book and the characters.
