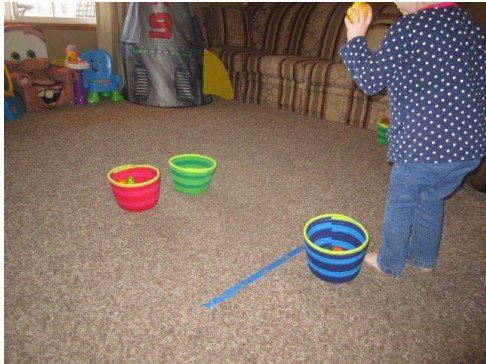


## **Fine and gross motor activities.**

## **Speaking and listening activities**

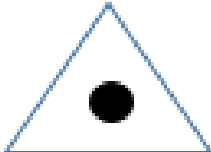
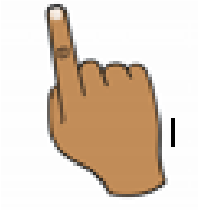

- Role play- Dress up in a costume, have a tea party. (Who will you be? Encourage language appropriate to the scenario e.g: in a shop, "How can I help you?")
- Pretend you are on the phone to each other (How was your day? What did you do?)

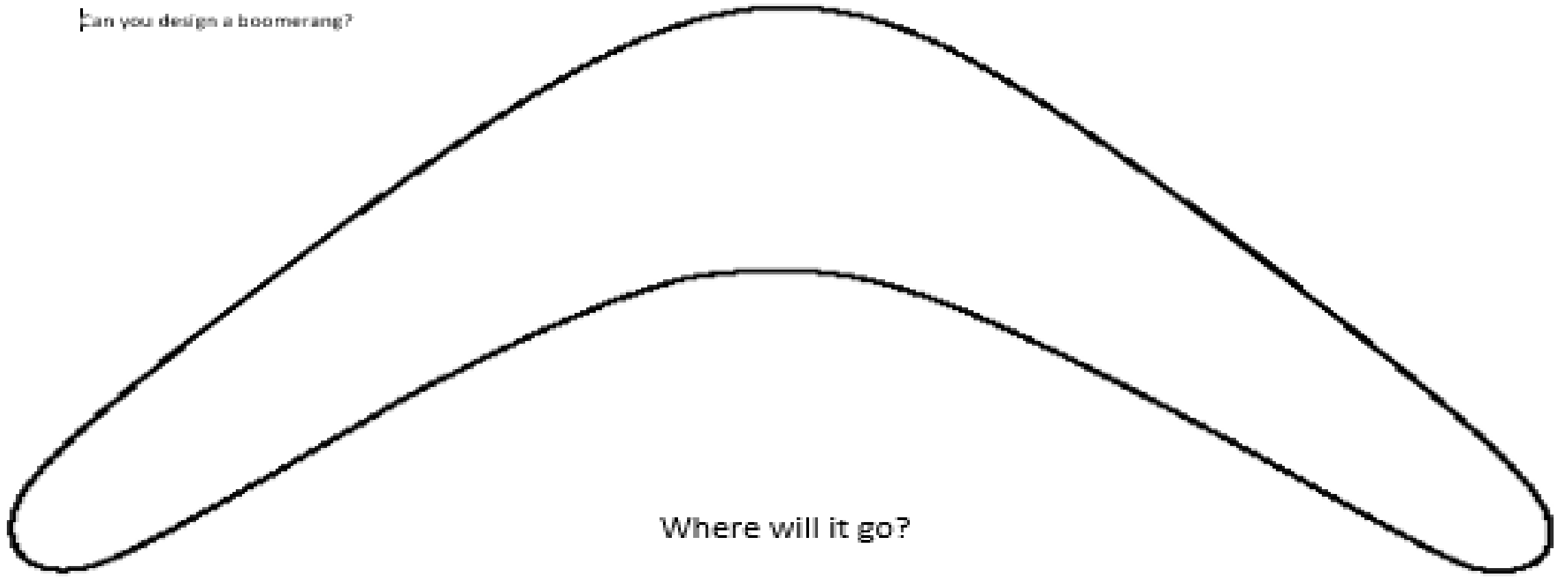
